Thanks to twitter and other social media which attracted our youth to the booths.

The Socio Economic Status Survey of 2011 in India has clearly identified that even in the families earning less than Rs. 5000 a month, a mobile is not a luxury but a necessary. The communication revolution in India could witness a penetration of 70 per cent where urban India accounts only to 29 per cent and 67 per cent of people are below poverty line. The internet penetration is 19 per cent and 10 per cent of people use social media. This clearly indicates that India is heading towards digital democracy.

Digital Democracy or E-democracy speaks about the role of ICT in democracy. E-Democracy empowers citizens of a country by not only treating them as voters but also as stake holders in proposing developing and creating laws.

Computer technology has transformed how we participate in democracy. Opinions are collected online on major issues. The way we cast our votes, the way our votes are counted and the way we choose who will lead are increasingly controlled by invisible computer software. Our Prime Minister tweets everyday to update citizens. Most U.S. states have adopted electronic voting and countries around the world are starting to collect votes over the Internet.

Significance of Digital Democracy

Democracy in America has become reliant on the Internet, because the Internet is a primary source of information for most Americans. The Internet educates people on democracy, helping people stay up to date with what is happening in their Government. Online advertising is becoming more popular for political candidates and group's opinion on propositions. The Internet is the first place that most people look for information and often the only place that they look. The reason for this and especially for younger voters, is that

it is easy and reliable when used correctly, thus lowering an individual's workload. This gives the user a sense of instant gratification that, in the era of multitasking on computers is crucial. If the information is not easy to find then most people will not look for it. Because the Internet is user friendly, people are more likely to research and get involved in politics. The Internet allows people to express their opinions about the government through an alias, anonymously and judgment free. Since a person can express themselves anonymously and from the comfort of their own home, the Internet gives incentive for people to participate in the government. Because of the number of people who use the Internet, a person who puts their ideas on a high-traffic website is capable of having influence over a large number of people.

The Internet enables citizens to get and post information about politicians and it allows those politicians to get advice from the people in larger numbers. This collective decision making and problem solving gives more power to the citizens and helps politicians make decisions faster. This creates a more productive society that can handle problems faster and more efficiently. Getting feedback and advice from the American population is a large part of a politician's job and the Internet allows them to function effectively with larger numbers of people's opinions. With this heightened ability to communicate with the public the American government is able to function more capably and effectively as a Democracy.
