

How to Reach CUK

Kalaburagi (formerly known as Gulbarga) is accessible by Air, Rail and Road from all parts of India. Nearest international airport to Kalaburagi is located in Hyderabad, at a distance of nearly 230 km. The city is well connected with all major cities of India like Bengaluru, Hyderabad, Mumbai Pune and Chennai through a number of regular trains. Buses also operate regularly between Kalaburagi and cities like Bengaluru, Hyderabad and Mumbai. The safer and faster way to reach CUK is by KSRTC bus from Kalaburagi Central Bus Stand. The Central Bus Stand is easily accessible by city buses plying frequently or by auto-rickshaws. The buses going to Aland and Solapur usually found on platform 10 at Central Bus Stand, will stop at the CUK Campus, Kadaganchi.

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Central University of Karnataka

The Central University of Karnataka (CUK) has been established by an Act of the Parliament (No. 3 of 2009) at Kalaburagi, to increase the access to quality higher education for people in less educationally developed districts which have a Graduate Enrolment Ratio of less than the national average of 11%.

The CUK, with its territorial jurisdiction all over Karnataka has been initiated its activities from the academic year beginning August 2009 in keeping with the philosophy of achieving and maintaining the highest levels of academic excellence, sensitivity to equity and access in enrolment and recruitment and emerging as a premier national educational and research institution in the country. The University has 654 acres campus, situated near Kadaganchi village in the district of Kalaburagi, Karnataka (30 km from Kalaburagi city towards Solapur). The main objective of the University is integrating the components of Teaching, Research, Innovation, Training and Skill Development (TRI-TSD) with an aspiration to excel in dual degree, post graduate and doctoral programs. The University offers the programs in following five dominant areas: Arts, Humanities, Management, Sciences and Engineering.

Department of History

The history of Hyderabad Karnataka Region or HKR (Kannada-speaking part of the Hyderabad State, ruled by the Nizams of Hyderabad until 17th September 1948. After merging with the Indian union, the region was part of Hyderabad State until 1956.

The Hyderabad-Karnataka/Northeast Karnataka region comprises Bidar, Yadgir, Raichur, Koppal and Gulbarga (now Kalaburagi) of Hyderabad state and, Bellary of Madras that are in the present state of Karnataka) too has been significantly enriched by new researches, particularly since a decade. With such context and to disseminate the upgraded knowledge, the Department of History, Central University of Karnataka, Kalaburagi proposes to organize one-day national workshop on “*New lights on*
