ABOUT KALABURAGI

The premodern containing the modern, modernity in various linguistic cultures, sources of rationality in the life of communities, modes of resistance and 'routes' and sites of modernity are few of the potentially innumerable concerns that ask for a critical look.

Explorations of such concerns in variety of genres, specially of literature, will be taken up in the two-day seminar. Some of the broad subthemes are:

- Modernity and the life of Community
- Modernity and constructions of Nation
- Traditions/Sources of Modernity
- The body in Modernity/Modernity and the Body
- Histories of migration and modernity

- Modernity and Linguistic cultures
- Desikaran
