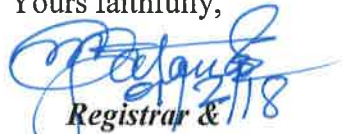

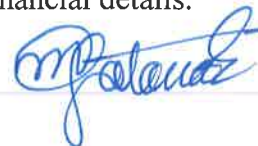
Item No.37.07: The minutes submitted by the Enquiry Committee related to Library –consideration and orders.

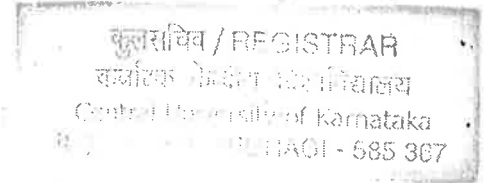

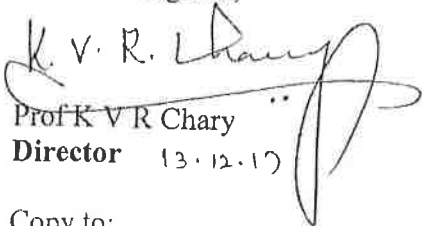

Performance under the contract shall be resumed as soon as practicable after which an event may come to an end or cease to exist, and the decision of CUK as to whether the supplies have been so resumed or not shall be final and conclusive, provided further that if the performance in whole or part of any obligation under this contract is prevented or delayed by reason of any such event for a period exceeding 60 days, either part may, at their option terminate the contract.

Arbitration

In the event of any question, dispute or difference arising under the agreement or in connection therewith (except as to the matters, the decision to which is specifically provided under this agreement), the same shall be referred to sole arbitration of the Registrar of CUK or any other person appointed by the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor. In the event of such Arbitrator to whom the matter is originally referred to vacates their office on resignation or otherwise or refuses to do work or neglecting their work or being unable to act as Arbitrator for any reasons, whatsoever, the Vice Chancellor of CUK shall appoint another person to act as Arbitrator in the place of outgoing Arbitrator and the person so appointed shall be entitled to proceed further with the reference from the stage at which it was left by the predecessor and that the award of the arbitrator shall be final and binding on both the parties. Service Provider will have no objection in any such appointment that arbitrator so appointed is an employee of CUK or a Government Servant or that he has to deal with the matter to which the agreement relates or that in the course of their duties as a CUK employee he has expressed their views on all or any of the matters in dispute. The adjudication of such Arbitrator shall be governed by the provisions of the Arbitration and conciliation Act 1996.

The venue of Arbitration proceedings shall be Office of CUK, Kalaburagi or such other place as the arbitrator may decide.

ANTECEDENTS OF CONTRACT MANPOWER:

The contractor regarding antecedents of the manpower who is employed by him in the contract shall bear full responsibility on his own part, and in case of any untoward conduct committed by the manpower; the contractor shall be liable to be dealt as per the Law. No contract labours shall be allowed an entry in the premises of CUK unless his/her police verification certificate is rendered by the Contractor to the, Security at CUK. Registrar, CUK as a principal Employer shall not bear any liability. And it is the responsibility of the contractor to ensure that all labours have police verification.

Minimum Wages as per Ministry of labour & Employment:

The Minimum wages revised and notified by Ministry of Labour & Employment office of the Chief Labour Commissioner(C) New Delhi, during the tenure of the contract shall be reimbursed by CUK along with the, Service charge, Service Tax if any, PF and ESI as applicable.

Other Obligations

- a) Central University of Karnataka, reserves the right to accept or reject any tender and to cancel the bidding process at any time prior to the award of the contract.
- b) The bidder whose tender is accepted, on receipt of the work orders, shall enter into an agreement with CUK for the initial period of one year and can be extended for the further period on mutual agreement. This is only an invitation to offer and not an order.
- c) The bidder shall execute an agreement along with the performance security valid for the Contract period plus sixty days.
- d) The undersigned reserves the right to select from the candidates proposed by the successful bidder and also the right to ask for replacement at any time.
- e) The successful bidder shall propose candidates in the ratio of 1:3.
- f) TDS shall be deducted in the bills of as applicable.
- g) The GST shall be paid by the Central University of Karnataka to the contractor who shall produce the previous month's challans along with the bill if applicable.
- h) Performance security will not carry any interest and will be refunded on cessation of agreement on fulfilment of the obligations by the manpower agency.

Center of Excellence in Wireless, Microwave, Optoelectronic Devices & Systems

Central University of Karnataka, Bangalore

Microwave, Wireless & Optoelectronics makes its presence felt in our life almost everywhere including mobile phones, security systems, satellite communication, medicine, security and even in the kitchen. It forms a major segment of the electronics industry. Over the years, the domestic consumption has grown to such a scale that India needs to have its own technology, products and standards that are well matched to meet its needs. At the present, work on these developments and training / education is rather sketchy and scattered with primary focus on defense and space. The number of microwave engineering students coming out of university system and IITs is gradually decreasing. Most of the engineering graduates are opting for software and information technology with the result that there is great paucity of microwave engineers for defense, space, telecommunication and other sectors. There is great shortage of microwave / optoelectronic personnel all over the world. There is need of good microwave / optoelectronic engineers in our country too.

With the present major emphasis on “Make in India” which includes not just manufacturing but from “Conceptualization to Architecture to IP & Design to Complete System Manufacturing”. Hence it has now become necessary to consider seriously the possibility of setting up a separate Centre of Excellence in Wireless, Microwave & Optoelectronics Engineering which caters to needs of Indian requirement in the specialized Education which also supports R&D, Industrial Ecosystem particularly for Start-Ups.

The market for wireless applications is expanding and this in turn is constantly driving the demand for a plethora of RF products with increased functionality and integration. Recent years have seen rapid changes in RF techniques as well as technology. This trend is continuing with use of higher microwave and millimeter wave frequencies with their inherent advantages of smaller size components and larger bandwidth.

Global demand for RF/microwave modules is forecast to reach \$1.7 billion and is expected to reach \$7.14 billion by 2022. Market is categorized into healthcare, defense, mobile & telecom, industrial, automotive, consumer & commercial, emerging next generation, and imaging. As per the analysis of Transparency Market Research (TMR), the global microwave oven market has been prognosticated to earn an around US\$25.0 bn by 2022 at a CAGR of 5.8% between 2017 and 2022. In 2017, the market had raked in an approximate US\$18.9 bn. The radio frequency (RF) and microwave test and measurement equipment market are on the verge of major changes over the next 5-10 years principally with a shift of focus from the commercial space from low frequencies to millimeter-wave frequencies. The global Radio Frequency (RF) components market is expected to reach USD 17.54 billion by 2022, according to a new study by Grand View Research, Inc.

It is apparent from the above market study there is a huge requirement of specialized Microwave, RF, Wireless, Optoelectronic Engineers in the country. Though there are some universities which

offer post graduate programs in Microwave / Optoelectronic Engineering they are not well integrated with the industry. The USP of the present initiative is to take a holistic view of this large requirement of very specialized knowledge skills and blend it with collaborating R&D, continuing education cell, supportive industrial eco-system for start-ups to create a Unique Center of Excellence.

Objective:

To establish a Centre of Excellence of international standard which produces high quality trained engineers, researchers, creation of significant intellectual property, design state of the art systems, train & update working engineers, incubate and support industries with appropriate eco-system and help the country in its vision and long-term plans.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU) FOR ACADEMIC AND CLINICAL COOPERATION

This Memorandum of Understanding is entered into on 15TH February 2018 between the CENTRAL UNIVERSITY OF KARNATAKA (CUK), KALABURAGI represented by the Registrar hereafter to be called the 'FIRST PARTY' and the Dharwad Institute of Mental Health and Neurosciences (DIMHANS), Dharwad represented by the Director, hereafter to be called the "SECOND PARTY".

Central University of Karnataka (CUK), Kalaburagi is one of the rapidly growing new Central Universities established under an Act of Parliament 2009 by Government of India. The University is fully funded by the University Grants Commission (UGC). The Hon'ble President of India is the Visitor of the University. The University has 654 acres campus, situated near Kadaganchi village in the district of Kalaburagi, Karnataka state. The main objective of the University is to integrate the components of Teaching, Research, Innovation, Training and Skill Development with an aspiration to excel in integrated programs, post graduate and doctoral programs.

Department of Social Work was established in the year 2012. The Department with a blend of interdisciplinary knowledge systems, aims to generate a cadre of professional social workers, who integrate the values-framework of social equality, social inclusion, human rights and social justice; and as agents of social change and social entrepreneurship, endeavor to achieve behavioral change, social transformation and social development. The Department is known for its local community development initiatives in villages and international collaboration with Nepal, Bhutan, Bangladesh, Sri Lanka and China.

Programmes offered –

i. Master of Social Work:

Specializations:

a) Social development b) Human Resource Management c) Medical and Psychiatric Social Work
d) Family-Child Welfare and Public Health e) Criminal Justice and Correctional Administration

ii. M.Phil. in Psychiatric Social Work

iii. Ph.D. in Social Work

Dharwad Institute of Mental Health and Neurosciences is an autonomous organization of Govt. of Karnataka, established in the year 1845. It is a 375 bed hospital spread in 18 acres. It has well-furnished and equipped library, laboratory, rehabilitation centre, free legal aid cell and family counselling centre. Academic wing for Psychiatric Social Work is already established. Mental health professionals and faculties are sufficiently recruited - there are Psychiatrists (13), Clinical Psychologists (6), Psychiatric Social Workers (7), and Psychiatric Nurses (52), are efficiently extending mental health services to the most excluded segment of society in the whole of North-Karnataka.

Now, therefore, Central University of Karnataka and Dharwad Institute of Mental Health and Neuroscience agree to enter the following MOU:

1. ACADEMIC:

1.1. Program : M.Phil. in Psychiatric Social Work, Central University of Karnataka

1.2. Mode : Regular mode

1.3. Duration : Two years (4 Semesters)

- 1.4. Intake : 8 (Eight) / as per CUK rules
- 1.5. Eligibility : Post-Graduation in Social Work/ MSW
- 1.6. Admission : Through the Entrance test conducted by the Department of Social Work, Central University of Karnataka. After admission process, the details of the candidates admitted to the Course will be informed to the Director, DIMHANS.
- 1.7. Medium : English
- 1.9. Board of Studies: Board of Studies is constituted by the Dept. of Social Work, CUK. However, a faculty may be invited to represent the DIMHANS from the Dept. of Psychiatric Social Work, and / Psychiatry/ Clinical Psychology.
- 1.8. Curriculum : As recommended by the Board of Studies, Dept. of Social Work and approved by the Academic Council, CUK. The curriculum shall be at the National standard of NIMHANS or any national or international mental health institution.

2. TEACHING:

- 2.1. Course Work:** One semester course work shall be conducted at CUK, as per UGC guidelines. However, clinical orientation will be carried at DIMHANS, as per the requirement. Head, Dept. of Social Work, CUK, and the Director/Head/In-charge, Dept. of Psychiatric Social Work, and/ Psychiatry/ Clinical Psychology, shall jointly plan the course implementation.
- 2.2. Workload:** After Course Work, one and half year course schedule shall be conducted both at CUK and DIMHANS, as per requirement. Teaching support will be given by both the Dept. of Social Work, CUK; and the qualified staff/faculty of the Dept. of Psychiatric Social Work/ Psychiatry/ Clinical Psychology, DIMHANS, without any financial obligation.
- 2.3. Teaching Plan:** Teaching and Clinical plan shall be planned by both the Dept. of Social Work, CUK, and the Dept. of Psychiatric Social Work, and/ Psychiatry/ Clinical Psychology, DIMHANS.
- 2.4. Clinical Placement:** Intensive and rigorous clinical training through sound theory, therapeutic practice, Rehabilitation Social Work and Research-base will be carried at DIMHANS. Candidates will be allotted to OPD, Departments, Rehabilitation Centres, Community Mental Health Projects or any agency as per the scheduled plan, issued by the Department of Psychiatric Social Work, and/ Psychiatry/Clinical Psychology, DIMHANS, as per the discussion held with the Dept. of Social Work, CUK. The candidates shall be allotted under Psychiatrist/s, the unit head, for all the clinical purposes; which will be monitored and supervised by the Dept. of Psychiatric Social Work, and/Clinical Psychology.
- 2.5. Mental Health Services:** *The M.Phil. candidates, as mental health professionals, are required to extend mental health services to patients, families and communities, both inside and outside DIMHANS, as per the need.*
- 2.6. Student Records:** Department of Psychiatric Social Work, DIMHANS shall maintain candidates' attendance records, therapeutic reports, case reports, intervention reports, working papers, field assignments or any practical reports/records. All the reports/records shall be handed over to the Dept. of Social Work, CUK. However, the candidates are required to submit all their assignments, records and reports in duplicate to the Dept. of Psychiatric Social Work, DIMHANS, and the Dept. of Social Work, CUK.
- 2.7. Student assessment:** Periodic assessment shall be carried as per the curriculum. Joint plan of assessment shall be shared between the Dept. of Social Work, CUK, and the Dept. of Psychiatric Social Work, DIMHANS.

2.8. DISSERTATION: As per the UGC and CUK Guidelines, each M.Phil. candidate will be allotted a Supervisor and/ Joint-supervisor. Supervisor will be from the Dept. of Social Work, and/Dept. of Psychology, CUK. Joint-Supervisor will be Psychiatrist and Psychiatric Social Worker, and/Clinical Psychologist from DIMHANS.

Dissertation topics will be decided in joint consultation, considering the needs of DIMHANS and depending upon the field/community needs.

2.9. Examination: Theory examination and Practical examination shall be planned as per the curriculum and guidelines of CUK, either at CUK and/ DIMHANS. The place of examination shall be informed to the Controller of Examinations, CUK, from time to time. Practical examinations will be conducted at DIMHANS with Psychiatrist/Psychiatric Social Worker/Clinical Psychologist as main examiner, and faculty of the Dept. of Social Work, CUK, will be a member of the panel. Head, Dept. of Social Work, CUK and the Director/Head/In-charge of Psychiatry/Psychiatric Social Work/Clinical Psychology, in consultation, will plan the examination schedule.

2.9.i) Evaluation: Head, Dept. of Social Work, CUK, will be in-charge of the Evaluation. All the answer scripts and examination records of the M.Phil. candidates will be under the control of the Head. Faculty of the Dept. of Psychiatric Social Work, and/ Psychiatry/Clinical Psychology, DIMHANS, may be recognized as evaluator/s to assess the examination records, with prior permission from the Controller of Examinations, CUK.

3. Student support from DIMHANS:

- 3.1. Arrangements will be made to provide hostel facility (both food and accommodation). The candidates will make payment towards the same.
- 3.2. Access to Library & E- Resources will be provided. Identity card will be issued to the candidates for book transaction.
- 3.3. ICT, Internet, cubicle and furniture support will be extended to all the candidates.
- 3.4. Two Classrooms will be provided to the candidates to engage classes.

4. PUBLICATION:

All publications of the M.Phil. candidates will be jointly shared by the candidate, supervisor and joint/supervisor of CUK and DIMHANS.

5. FINANCIAL:

- 5.1. M.Phil. Course shall be implemented without financial obligation on the part of the DIMHANS.
- 5.2. Any damage to the property of DIMAHANS, caused by the candidate/s, knowingly or unknowingly, the candidates will restore/compensate the damage.

6. MONITORING:

- 6.1. A Committee consisting of Head and a faculty from the Dept. of Social Work, CUK, and Director/Head and a faculty from the Dept. of Psychiatric Social Work, Psychiatry and Clinical Psychology, shall hold period review meetings either at DIMHANS or CUK, to monitor the effective implementation of the M.Phil. Program.
- 6.2. The review report shall be submitted to the Registrar, CUK and the Director, DIMHANS, to facilitate the effective implementation of the program.
- 6.3. The committee may recommend needful measures for making the M.Phil. Course, an impact making one.

7. DEGREE AWARD:

- 7.1. Marks Cards and Degree Certificates will be issued by the Central University of Karnataka.
- 7.2. Name of DIMHANS will appear on the marks card of the candidates, as appropriately decided by the CUK.

8. Duration of MOU:

The MOU shall be in force for a period of five academic years. It may be renewed for a specified period after due consultation from both the institutions. There shall not be any breach of agreement during this period. Any dispute or conflict of interest, shall be resolved amicably.

9. GOVERNING LAW:

All the matters related to the implementation of the M.Phil. Course are governed by the Act and Ordinances of CUK, Guidelines of UGC and other competent authorities.

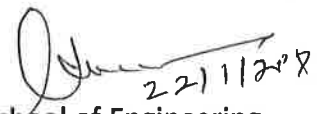

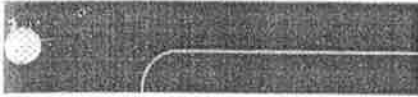

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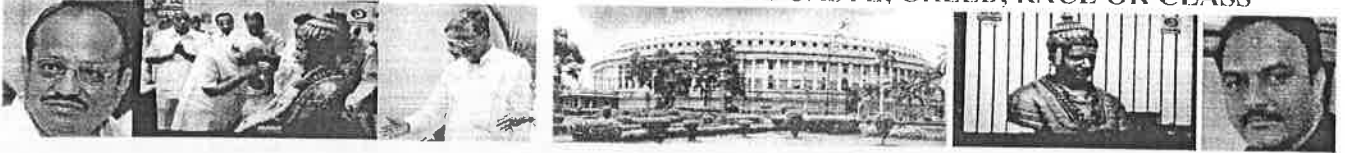

Subject: Enhancement of age of superannuation of doctors other than Central Health Service (CHS) doctors to 65 years.

The undersigned is directed to refer to the subject cited above and to say that the approval of the Union Cabinet was solicited on the following proposals:-

- (i) ex-post facto approval of the Union Cabinet for enhancement of superannuation age of doctors of Indian Railways Medical Service to 65 years, and
- (ii) approval to the proposals of the respective Ministries/Departments [M/o of AYUSH (AYUSH Doctors), Department of Defence (civilian doctors under Directorate General of Armed Forces Medical Service), Department of Defence Production (Indian Ordnance Factories Health Service Medical Officers), Dental Doctors under D/o Health & Family Welfare, Dental doctors under Ministry of Railways and of doctors working in Higher Education and Technical Institutions under Department of Higher Education] to enhance the superannuation age to 65 years under their administrative control.
- (iii) ex-post facto approval for enhancement of superannuation age of doctors working in Central Universities and IITs (Autonomous Bodies) under Department of Higher Education to 65 years; and approval for enhancement of superannuation age of doctors in Major Port Trusts (Autonomous Bodies) under Ministry of Shipping to 65 years.
- (iv) that doctors shall hold the administrative posts till the date of attaining the age of 62 years and thereafter their services shall be placed in Non-Administrative positions.

2. The Union Cabinet in its meeting held on 27th September, 2017 has approved the aforesaid proposals. A copy of the minutes of the meeting of the Cabinet is enclosed. It is requested that necessary action for implementation of the decision of the Cabinet may be taken in respect of doctors working under the administrative control of the respective Ministry/Department and covered by the decision of the Cabinet.
